
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# The Courage To Teach: Exploring The Inner Landscape Of A Teacher's Life, 10th Anniversary Edition

Parker J. Palmer's The Courage to Teach is a book absolutely critical for someone in a teaching position, or interested in teaching. However, though it is about teaching, anyone and everyone can benefit from reading it. It transcends the subject of teaching and is applicable to life in general. He describes teaching and learning as a great paradox, but a paradox that must be embraced if we are to learn and teach properly.Palmer suggests that the modern mind is full of division and disconnectedness and must be remedied by community and connectedness. Throughout the book, he shows how this can be accomplished in various ways. It is a truly profound book. I have learned a lot from reading it and I highly recommend it.

Parker Palmer's book, The Courage to Teach, advocates for an authentic way of teaching that is based on connection and inspiration rather than on competition and pride. He powerfully documents his own journey--even modeling what it looks like to be an authentic teacher--and shares his ideas and experiences with clarity, compassion and boldness.
