

The nonfiction books the author has chosen are rich enough to merit the close reading and re-reading, and the QR code access to videos of her teaching and debriefing the lessons with colleagues are so instructive. Lots of emphasis on the small group work that is necessary for students to fold in the behaviors of close, attentive reading on their own.

The learning pathways really promote transfer and the inquiry questions are creative and motivating. As a District Language Arts Coordinator, this book has quickly become my go-to resource when it comes to teaching and curriculum writing!
