
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Daily Geography Practice, Grade 3

This is a good, basic beginning to understanding how to read maps, and basic understanding of world geography. The book is outlined as an assignment per day format, but we have used it as a once per week assignment (doing all of the assignments for that week in a day), which seemed to be more logical (the one assignment per day would take about 3 minutes, not enough time to "get into it"). It has accurate, clear directions and has been a great geography adjunct text for my 3rd grader, who can work independently with it. Enjoying it!

My daughter and I are enjoying the geography lessons. It is silly how each chapter is divided to be taught in a classroom over a whole week when the work of one chapter can be completed in about 10 to 15 minutes. We do one chapter a day as part of our homeschooling over the summer (my

daughter attends school the rest of the year). Regardless of the layout, the chapters are good for learning US geography, especially for kids who go to schools that don't think geography is important. I plan to get the 4th grade level when we finish this one.

Mostly studying the US states, this Grade 3 Daily Geography book builds on the skills learned in the earlier levels. Very early on (Week 4) it brings in the intermediate directions of northeast, northwest, southeast and southwest. If you are looking for a geography book that studies different parts of the world then this is NOT for you!There are 5 lessons per week (Monday thru Friday) with each day having 2 questions that require a written answer. At the end of the week there is an extra challenge. Sometimes our kids do more than one lesson a day as they really enjoy this curriculum.PLEASE NOTE that the Daily Geography books are set up for classroom use and printed expecting you to photocopy the student's pages. What do I mean by this? Each week there is a "Teacher's Page" which includes not only the answers but also some information to help the teacher teach the students along with some useful vocabulary. If you are a homeschooler using this product, like us, you will not want to just hand your child this book as the temptation to cheat will be WAY too strong. My advice is to tear out all the perforated pages and only photocopy the pages your child needs. (We use a 3 ring binder to put ours in.) This way, you still have the original book for your next child thus saving you money. As a family we LOVE this curriculum and highly recommend it.

This a a good workbook. It should not be used alone. However, it is a good resource. Throughout the week, we learn about different countries of the world, but on Fridays, we use this workbook to learn geography skills. I recommend this book.

We used this book for homeschool geography for 3rd grade, and looked forward to doing this every day. The only reason that I do not give this book 5 stars is because my son says that he can't remember much of what he learned in this book, and he usually remembers facts. Because of this, we found that the book needs to be supplemented with a globe, maps, and whatever other resources we have, to make it as interesting and memorable as possible. The book alone does an excellent job of teaching many geography basics, such as cardinal and intermediate directions, and we are much further along than we would be without it. We like it enough that we are now doing Daily Geography for 4th grade, and plan to continue the series.

This is an excellent book for classroom use! The maps are great and very appropriate for third

graders. They are clear and easy to read. My favorite thing is that there are overhead maps already included with the book. This saves me the time of making them to use with the lessons. Each map will be used for a week of geography learning. There are 2 questions per day for each map and a challenge question at the end of the week that requires students to extend their learning with the map of the week. I can't wait to use this in my classroom!

I ordered this book for my daughter, who I homeschool. It is a very well done book, with a short lesson at the beginning of each week and a question or two to be completed a day. We are very glad we chose it!!

This is a fantastic series that is easy to use for home school. I use it as a supplement to a classical curriculum, and do the entire lesson in one day. The over heads are nice and worksheets look good and are easy for my son to do on his own after the lesson.

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
