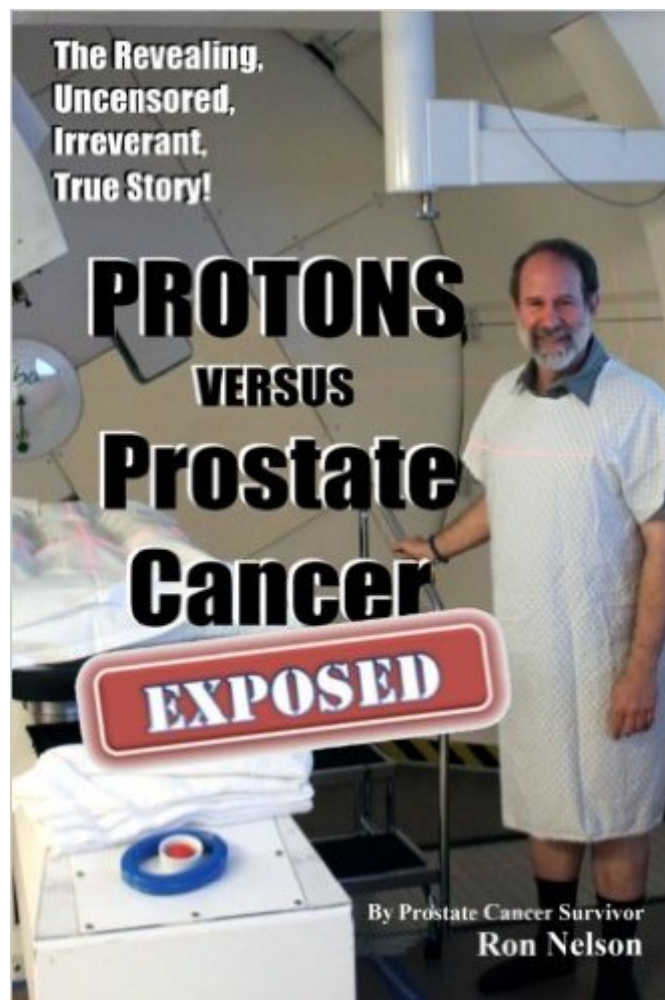

The quotes are symbolic of my tongue being in my cheek, as the author explains early on in the book. The bottom line is that if you're going to get cancer, prostate cancer is the one to get. Treated early, it's 100% curable, and treated with proton therapy, the outcome is excellent, the side effects are negligible, and the treatment process itself can be a lot of fun. This book is fun.
